The committee appointed at the Nov. 6 Historical Society meeting to negotiate with the Community Foundation (see minutes, p. 9) is meeting each Saturday at noon in Starbucks. Jointly with Marilyn Saveson and Helen Pestel, the committee has obtained (1) a transfer of \$6800. from the Society's Restoration Fund at the Community Foundation to the Society's checking account. The \$6800. is reimbursement for moneys paid out of the checking account for restoration work.

(2) As a result of joint negotiations and letters sent by Helen and Kim to satisfy Tom Rubey's request for landscape plans and arrangements for hooking up to the sewer, Tom Rubey has promised to release early in 2009 the \$50,000. matching funds committed by the New Albany Company in the Contribution Agreement.

John Ayres has obtained Emily Eby's cooperation and that of other associates at Inniswood to provide a detailed landscape plan and sketches.

Kim reports that equipment crossing the Ealy property to excavate Rose Run, in exchange for the privilege, will do excavation for the Society's sewer hookup. Neil Kirby has asked the Village to reduce or possibly to waive hook-up fees (as it has done for other of the area's cultural institutions).

Next, we had Scarecrow-making, supervised by the Clouse Road crew of Catherine Saveson (& Willow & Liam), Wendy Schneider (with Thor & Sage), Shawn Rasmussen, and Joanne Adams.

Then there was the Candle-Making, set up in advance by Julie DiIullio, and managed by our loyal Presbyterian volunteers: Ann & John Liptak, Joseph & Rae Lehman, and Robert & Elizabeth Mitro.

Last but not least, there was a Food and Cider table, in the hands of Sharon Carter, Sine & John Ayres, David Cline, Marty Saveson, Marilyn Regrut (& grand-kids), and Bob Mowery. Others pitched in and helped stir the big kettle of bean soup which simmered all day over an open fire.

As always, stalwarts Don Shoemaker and Steve Bevelhymer set up the tables & tent for us and took them all down at the end. They also got the fires going for the soup kettle and the candle-wax melting. Thanks to all who helped, including many not listed here.

Final approval has at long last been given by the Village of New Albany for the building of the front steps. Work should begin any day now.

MINUTES OF THE SOCIETY MEETING OF NOV. 6

A birthday celebration was held at Summerville honoring Aziel Shockley's 100th birthday. It was well attended by family members, friends, and Society members.

After the party, the meeting was called to order by President Kim Cathell. The minutes of the October meeting were read. Motion to accept by John Ayres, seconded by Sharon Carter. All ayes. The treasurer's report was read by Kim (in Helen's absence), explained in detail, and distributed to those in

attendance. The balance at the end of October is \$5232.94. Gross profit from the Harvest the Arts Festival is \$1961. Motion to accept by David Cline, seconded by Kathy Yager.

Kim announced that the approval process for the Ealy House front steps requires another drawing; The Village requires this and it is being worked on.

The Christmas dinner has been planned for the regular meeting date, Thursday, Dec. 4, at 6:30 p.m. at Vito's, located in the Links development.

The Board will meet soon to make plans for 2009 and set up a budget. Yearly operating funds have usually been at \$14,000 to \$15,000. We must have new ideas for fundraisers to meet these financial obligations. Detailed discussion of funding ensued; it was noted that funds from NACO are still pending. Discussion also included return from investments and required fees.

Nancy Ferguson made a motion that John Saveson be charged with investigating the moneys from the NA Community Foundation. No second, motion died. Nancy then moved that John Ayres, John Saveson, Neil Kirby, and Kim Cathell comprise a committee to meet with the NA Foundation regarding moneys, and report back to the membership with information in writing. Seconded by Naomi. All ayes.

Discussion of possible open house, selling Christmas ornaments from trees. Craft efforts are ongoing, will meet again next week at Kim's home on Friday.

David Cline reported on a meeting he attended on the Vets Memorial Project. The present memorial must be moved because it is in the right-of-way. All names from the old memorial will be included on the new one. Locations are under discussion.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:05 p.m -- Marilyn Regrut, Secretary

HIGHLIGHTS OF NOV. 11 BOARD MEETING

A budget for 2009 was worked out and passed by Board. Finances in general were discussed, with emphasis on ways to get better interest on our investments and also on simply how to raise more money.

Kim suggested a paver brick fundraiser. Special bricks would be purchased for, say, the front walkway from Ealy House front steps to the walking trail near the street. Individuals in the Society and in the village would buy them for \$50.00 each, and specify 2 or 3 lines of text—a name usually. The bricks would cost the Society much less.

HIGHLIGHTS OF NOV. 18 BOARD MEETING

Joseph Dotolo, financial advisor of Ameriprise Financial, made a presentation on various kinds of investments, with emphasis on safety and on good returns.

Helen announced that the Community Foundation had released \$6800. for reimbursement of restoration expenses for the Ealy House.

Kim reported on the Rose Run community meeting of Nov. 12 and the "rechanneling" of the creek behind the Ealy House.

Good news: Our plan for the front steps has now been officially approved by the Village. Bad news: We cannot open the Ealy House to the public because we do not have an occupancy permit, which now depends upon the steps plus a safe walkway to the steps from a parking area. One suggestion for a temporary solution: a metal handicap ramp which can be laid over a pathway and stairs.
